3. Application

Reflection Questions:

1. Why do you think the king demanded that his “magicians, enchanters, sorcerers and astrologers” be able to tell him what his dream was as well as what it means?
2. Verse 11 gives some foreshadowing for what is to come. How does it set the stage for what happens in the rest of the story?
3. Why was Daniel so quick to volunteer his services to the king?
4. After Daniel tells the king he will interpret the dream, what does he do? Why do you think this is significant?
5. What can learn from Daniel's prayer of praise in verses 20-23? What would this prayer of praise encourage the original exiles reading this passage to do?
6. What did Nebuchadnezzar's dream mean? Why was this an important message for the Jews in exile?
7. What does it look like to seek wisdom from God? How might you be more proactive in seeking wisdom?
